times a month. After a few weeks they learned there was a regional at the Statler and they entered an event. Somehow they got a couple of red points so when the ACBL started with its rainbow foolishness they didn't need anything but 300 points including 50 reds. Of course, all points were more difficult to get in those days.

- On the question of how he learned to play bridge – John responded “I am an autodidact. I learned the most when I got a job teaching bridge in Sweet Home’s adult education program.”
- He was fortunate enough to have played with some fine players. **Ray Blake** taught him more than any single player. Ray shared his notes with him. They were better than any book out at the time. He became a life master playing with Ray in an afternoon game run by **Allen Greer** at the Eldrich Club.
- Locally John admires **Dan Gerstman** and **Jim Mathis** the most because he’s known them the longest. Dan has been kind enough to invite him to have a game from time to time. All of the local experts are superb players. More important in John’s view is that they are ladies and gentlemen at the table. John thinks western New York and Ontario players mostly put people first. That’s one of the reasons why bridge in this area is so much fun.
- On his goal for Duplicate Bridge, John answered: “Working in the Tuesday afternoon mentor and 299er groups I hope I can help people acquire the skills to enable them to enjoy the game as much as I do.”

Personally:

- John’s wife Lucille does not play bridge. They have many other common interests. His children, grandchildren, family and friends make him feel very fortunate to be alive.
- John was a social studies teacher for 33 years. Now he’s an independent scholar and poet. He has published articles in literary journals, participate in scholarly conferences, and has had poetry in many magazines and newspapers locally and around the country. Among the denizens of the local literary scene, John is well known for his poetry readings.
- John is an avid golfer (aka “hacker”) and enjoys the NBA as a spectator sport. John was very sorry when the Buffalo Braves moved to California. If he’s ever paid the billions he should have earned as a teacher he’ll try to buy them back.

Goren Visits Charity Match 1962

Bascom-Murphy Pair Wins Tourney

William E. Bascom and **Dr. Lawrence M. Murphy**, with a score of 206-1/2, won the duplicate bridge Open Pairs charity tournament held Wednesday evening at the Hotel Statler Hilton.

The entire proceeds of the tournament were donated to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and the Institute of Logopedics, the two designated beneficiaries of the American Contract Bridge League's 1962-1963 charity programs.

There was a total of 45 tables in play, divided into three sections. The attendance was probably the largest ever in Buffalo for a tournament at which only local players participated.

By coincidence, **Charles H. Goren**, Courier-Express columnist was in Buffalo



for the day and made a brief talk to the audience reminiscing on his frequent appearances here many years ago at the beginning of his notable

bridge career. Goren also chatted with **Mrs. Ralph W. Gordon**, outstanding local woman player who has been his partner often, and **Hubert A. Gerstman**, co-chairman of the tourney.

Second-place winners were **Mrs. Raymond Blake** and **Lawrence J. Meehan** with a score of 204; tied for third were **Charles Meitner – Mrs. Henry W. Ferel** and **Mrs. John J. Carney – Gerald Dottery**, 198; fifth-place winners were **Mrs. Paul Strachan** and **Mrs. Al Rosenfeld**, 195; sixth were Mr. and Mrs. **Gordon**. 193-1/2.

Goren would open the W hand 1♠, 'the
suit below the singleton.' Weak Roman
players would open it 2♦s (11 – 14 & any
3 suits). Standard bidders will say 1♦. No
matter what, it's hard to stay out of the
unmakeable 3NT except for the few
cautious Es who carry on to 5♦s. The
Moysian ♥ fit seems an unlikely contract
these days and the less than 25% slam is
unbiddable unless West takes a flyer on
the belief that they've missed a 'cold' 3NT

Interesting hand because most players
who bid game will go down in NT without
a defensive error like letting the club suit
block

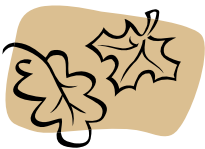
